“Using Classes in Microsoft Access”

Classes are one of the most overlooked features of Microsoft Access. Many developers understand the syntax of the classes, but not how and when to use them in their applications. Chris will present 4 four situations ideally suited for using classes. Also, he will present some advanced class techniques.

“Amazon Web Services: Webscale Computing”

Presenter: Mike Culver, Amazon Web Services

What's possible in a post Web 2.0 world? Innovation continues at a mind-bending pace, and this presentation will showcase some thought-provoking new directions that Web Services are headed in. The presentation will provide an overview of **Amazon Web Services**, and feature a code demonstration showing how .NET developers are able to easily build managed clients for these services. Included will be a Web Service named Mechanical Turk that allows computers to make requests of people, an online storage service, and more. and then dive into a code sample that shows how to create a C# Smart Client

to use Amazon Simple Storage (a.k.a. Amazon S3) as a virtual disk drive with a Windows Explorer-ish front end. Amazon spent ten years and over \$1 billion developing a world-class technology and content platform that powers Amazon web sites for millions of customers every day. Most people think "Amazon.com" when they hear the word; however developers are excited to learn that there is a separate technology arm of the company, known as Amazon Web Services or AWS. Using AWS, developers can build software applications leveraging the same robust, scalable, and reliable technology that powers Amazon's retail business. AWS has now launched eleven services with open API's for developers to build applications, with the result that over 160,000 developers have registered on Amazon's developer site to create applications based on these services.
